Black Belt Grading

I am looking to hold a Black Belt grading around June / July. As we now have a number of people who will be eligible to grade at that time, we will start to gear up the training towards that. A black belt is the recognised standard by which any martial artist is measured and, as such, is not something that is given lightly. You will be expected to earn the grade !!!

Weapons Work

January saw the first of a series of classes dedicated to weapons work, with the Junior class training with the 4' staff and the sword. The point of these sessions is not primarily to teach how to use a weapon but to show how many of the empty hand techniques stem from the use of weapons in battle, originally.

Self-Defence Sessions

Master Mark James has recently been running a series of self-defence / close-quarters combat sessions for the adults' class.

As Taekwondo stylists, we tend to emphasise our kicking but, often, we don't get the chance to use our feet in a real world situation. These sessions were geared towards alternative techniques and tactics.
